Flu Season 2021/22 and Covid-19 Boosters

We are already working hard to plan a smooth and efficient flu programme for Autumn/Winter 2021. Last year, despite the pandemic and all of the difficulties the restrictions posed, we had a hugely successful flu programme, managing to reach our flu vaccination target before the end of December! We are aiming for a similarly successful programme this year and will be sending out information regarding flu jab appointments as soon as plans are finalised. We expect our flu clinics to be open and vaccinations to start in September.

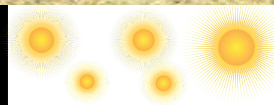
The Joint Committee on Vaccinations and Immunisations (JCVI) eligibility criteria for flu vaccinations this year is as follows; all children aged 2 to 15 (but not 16 years or older) on 31 August 2021, those aged 6 months to under 50 years in clinical risk groups, pregnant women, those aged 50 years and over, those in long-stay residential care homes, carers, close contacts of immunocompromised individuals, frontline health and social care staff employed by; a registered residential care or nursing home, registered domiciliary care provider, a voluntary managed hospice provider, Direct Payment (personal budgets) and/or Personal Health Budgets, such as Personal Assistants. Information on vaccination priority groups outlined by NHS England and how/where you can receive your vaccine will be released at a later date.

We are currently working with the East Cornwall Primary Care Network to see whether a collaborative surgery approach, similar the initial Covid-19 vaccinations, will work best for Covid boosters. Plans are yet to be confirmed and we are awaiting information from NHS England as to how and when the booster programme will run alongside the flu programme. We will publish further information about this once plans are finalised and NHS England releases more information.

Where to get your Covid-19 vaccine

Adults aged 18 or over DO NOT need to wait to be contacted by the NHS. To book an appointment or find your nearest walk-in centre please visit the NHS website [here](http://www.nhs.uk) (www.nhs.uk) or call 119 free of charge.

*The JCVI has recently approved the use of Pfizer vaccinations for young people aged 16-17. People in this age group can either wait to be contacted by NHS England to book an appointment or attend a walk in centre to receive a vaccination. Please use the link above to find your nearest walk-in clinic.

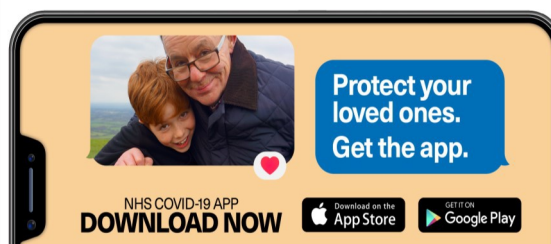
Similarly we would like to say farewell to our colleagues who have recently left the practice and to wish them every success in their future endeavors.

Get to know the role...

Frank Baidoo - Superintendent Pharmacist

Our Superintendent Pharmacist Frank has a degree in pharmacy, a degree in Public Health and is a qualified prescriber. He has also recently completed a Degree in Clinical Pharmacy. He uses his expert knowledge of medicines and health to provide the best care for our patients. Frank is a highly trained health professional who is qualified to deal with the composition, properties, interactions, proper use and distribution of medicines. Frank works alongside his team of a Pharmacy Technician and Pharmacy Assistants to deliver a fantastic pharmacy service for our patients. As a Pharmacist Frank's role includes making sure medicines are used safely, working with patients to understand how to take their medicines and get the most out of them, taking a history, examining, identifying and providing advice to patients on minor ailments such as coughs and colds, signposting where necessary, working alongside other healthcare professionals including doctors and nurses so patients are prescribed the most appropriate medicines for them, providing advice on health and lifestyle such as stopping smoking, and managing long term conditions such as high blood pressure.

NHS Community Pharmacist Consultation Service

The NHS Community Pharmacist Consultation Service (CPCS) was launched by NHS England and NHS Improvement on the 29 October 2019. The practice reception team, or NHS 111 call advisor will make a digital referral to a convenient pharmacy, where the patient will receive pharmacist advice and treatment for a range of minor illnesses, or for an urgent supply of a previously prescribed medicine. Should the patient need to be escalated or referred to an alternative service, the pharmacist can arrange this.

The service is helping to alleviate pressure on GP appointments and emergency departments, in addition to harnessing the skills and medicines knowledge of pharmacists. This service will be available at Oak Tree Pharmacy soon!

Referral Waiting List Times

NHS Services across England are working hard to get through a backlog of patients on their waiting lists due to cancelled or postponed routine appointments during the Covid-19 pandemic.

If you have been referred by your GP for a specialist appointment and have been added to a hospital waiting list please do not contact the surgery to find out when your appointment is likely to be. We do not have details of the hospital waiting lists. We would encourage you to get in touch with the surgery if your symptoms have worsened and you feel you may need further treatment or advice from the GP whilst you are waiting for your appointment, however, the GP is very unlikely to be able to speed up any waiting times.

[The latest message from Derriford Hospital reads:](#)

We have reduced capacity for appointments due to caring for patients both with and without COVID-19. If you are waiting to hear about an appointment, please be patient. We are doing our best, but you may have to wait longer for your appointment.

Unfortunately, we've had to postpone some routine appointments and routine inpatient surgery in order to free up staff to help care for patients in the hospital with COVID-19 and other emergencies. However, we are continuing to see those patients who need to be seen urgently or as an emergency.

Cancer related care is continuing as normal.

COVID-19 Virological Surveillance

Oak Tree Surgery and Pensilva Health Centre are participating in a national virology surveillance programme to monitor the spread of respiratory viruses (including influenza, COVID-19, RSV) and measure the effectiveness of influenza vaccinations through the winter season.

Patients presenting with an influenza-like-illness, lower respiratory tract infection or other symptoms consistent with COVID-19 may be eligible to participate.

Eligible patients will be offered a self-testing kit which will be delivered directly to the patients' home.

CASNET2 Study

This practice is taking part in the CASNET2 study. This is a study run by researchers at the University of Oxford looking at a new electronic safety netting tool which is part of the practice computer system. The tool helps GPs to make sure that patients get followed up if they have symptoms that might lead to a new diagnosis.

The researchers are hoping to find out whether the tool helps to reduce the time it takes for people to get a diagnosis. They will be using anonymised patient data from the practice computer system to find out how well the tool works. Using data in this way will not affect your privacy or care, and no-one will be able to identify you personally, but please speak to your GP if you have any concerns, or if you wish to opt out of the study.

The Musings of an Anonymous GP

When will GPs come out of hiding and give patients the service they deserve?

General practice has changed significantly. Patients feel in the dark. Concerns include locked doors, being unable to get help from a GP or unable to be seen face to face. As a GP, I will try to explain the changes.

Walking into surgeries last year we had patients with COVID, patients without masks and vulnerable or unvaccinated patients. Queuing indoors was not safe. Surgeries introduced intercoms to manage this. As vaccinations increase and rates decrease, most surgeries will return to open doors.

In some surgeries you can't now simply request to see a GP. One reason for this is the idea of 'triage'. The work GPs are expected to do has increased far beyond funding and staffing. New specialist roles have been introduced to help, such as Nurse Practitioners, Pharmacists, Social Prescribers, Physios and medical admin staff. New services have also developed such as eye units and minor injuries units.

GPs have a unique role within all this, often where there is medical complexity.

We can't expect patients to navigate these complicated options alone. If we know a bit about your problem, we can direct you to the best person to help you. This means that when you have a problem only a GP can manage, this can happen. This change is uncomfortable for everyone. GPs prefer a mixture. But meeting everyone's needs is more important.

GPs have worked face to face throughout the pandemic. After talking on the phone, we would see anyone where we judged that the benefits outweighed the risks. There are incredibly sad stories where it was felt important signs were missed. There will also be unknown lives that were saved by these precautions. As the risks of COVID transmission vary, we vary the threshold for our face to face appointments accordingly. The risks are now less, but remain significant.

Increased telephone consultations are also about efficiency. You can't under fund General Practice without consequence. There are occasions when the phone is both effective, efficient and safe. Every day we are forced to make intensely challenging decisions about how to manage each individual as the pressures are simply unmanageable otherwise. No GP would have chosen the situation we find ourselves in.

Whilst less visible, GPs are delivering more appointments than ever. Triaging patients to the most appropriate person may feel restrictive, but it makes sure we're available when you need us. This year we won't have got everything right. Changes may have felt confusing and frustrating. Communication can be improved. But we care enormously for our patients. At times, the very changes that feel unwelcome are happening because of the deep care that General Practice has for all its patients.

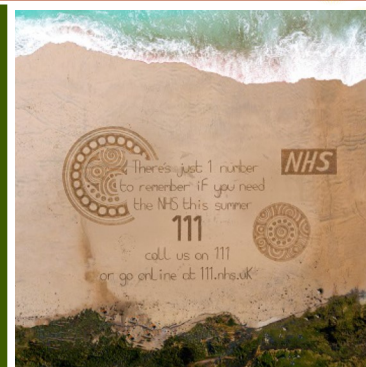

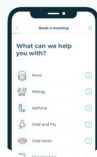
